ABOUT THE PROGRAM

The Dental Assisting Program prepares individuals to assist the dentist in the delivery of dental treatment. Students begin their journey in an 18-station manikin-based simulation lab and practice their skills in an 18-chair state of the art dental clinic. For two semesters, students participate in clinical rotations at a variety of dental offices in order to gain experience performing various dental procedures. Graduates may be eligible to take the Dental Assisting National Board Examination to become Certified Dental Assistants, As a Dental Assistant II, defined by the dental laws of North Carolina, graduates may work in dental offices, community clinics, schools, public health agencies, industry, and professional education.



Students interested in Health Sciences like to help people feel better. They can work independently, but prefer to work in groups or teams. They are detail-oriented, compassionate, and think critically to solve problems. They work well in stressful situations and do not get queasy around blood or bodily fluids. Graduates find jobs working in medical or wellness environments.
