Self-Identification and Impact Statement for Health Science Tests

Central Carolina Community College administers several different tests as required by the many Health Science programs offered at our college. Some Health Science programs require students to take the ATI-Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) and/or the ATI-PN Predictor. Please check with Student Onboarding & Success to ensure you're registered for the correct, and necessary exam, for your degree pathway.

Once you provide appropriate medical documentation **and** this Self-Identification and Impact Statement for the disability to the Office of Student Accessibility Services, they will send the accommodation notice to the assessment specialist.

The standard format for medical documentation required by Central Carolina Community College's Office of Student Accessibility Services is as follows:

- Diagnosis from an appropriate licensed professional (with signature)
- Diagnosis on official letterhead with contact information (not on a prescription memo pad)
- Information must be current (within 3 years) and include: diagnosis and symptoms, recommendation for academic accommodations, and a list of all currently-prescribed medications and side effects if not taken as prescribed
- If you have additional documentation, please feel free to submit what you have available for review by the Coordinator of Student Accessibility Services.

It is the student's responsibility to schedule test(s), prepare for tests, and arrive on time.

The placement tests may be scheduled by contacting Student Onboarding & Success.
